



STATION CASINOS SPORTS BOOK HOUSE WAGERING RULES

1. Please verify wager accuracy before accepting your bet or leaving the wagering counter.
 - (A) Tickets go as written (see 1.E).
 - (B) Once a wager is accepted by both parties, it will not be voided prior to the start of the event except at the discretion of management and with the approval of both parties. Wagers may only be rescinded with the approval of the Nevada State Gaming Control Board Chairman or his designee.
 - (C) Computer generated point spreads / odds shall determine winners, losers, ties and payout odds.
 - (D) If posted propositions are not updated simultaneously with computer system changes, an announcement will be made within the Book area of point spread, odds changes, followed by the updating of posted propositions. Wagering tickets are official, and may not always match propositions on the odds display. Management will make every effort to update the odds display within ten minutes of the change.
 - (E) For the protection of all concerned, management will retain a record of all point spreads and odds in case of obvious technical or human error.
2. Station Casinos is not responsible for lost, stolen, altered or unreadable wagering tickets.
3. Station Casinos reserves the right to refuse any wager (s).
4. Minimum and maximum wagers on all sporting events shall be determined by Station Casinos.

5. All "games"(team contests) must be played on the date scheduled, to be considered "Action", unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display. Game start or conclusion times delayed or extended beyond midnight are not recognized as date changes for wagering purposes.
 - (A) "Events" including golf tournaments, boxing matches, mixed martial arts , tennis matches, auto races, track and field, Olympic and international tournaments or events must be held within 30 days of scheduled date to be considered "Action", unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
 - (B) Management is not responsible for location changes. If a game or event is moved from original location, all wagers are "Action".
 - (C) All (fighting, boxing, mixed martial arts, etc.) wagers including win, go/don't go (will/won't go), k.o., decision, draw, etc., will have action regardless of any change in weight class, scheduled length of the bout or championship sanction, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display. All fighting "pick the round" proposition wagers are "No Action" (Refunded) if the scheduled length of the bout is changed from the distance displayed by the sports book, or on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
 - (D) All future book wagers (index/odds to win a future contingency, including league, conference, division, championship, or "other events," etc.) are "Action" as long as a winner/champion is officially declared, regardless of season length or playoff format. All future book bets are "Action" regardless of team relocation, name change, date change or a change in league affiliation.
6. For betting purposes, the winner of an event or game will be determined on the date and approximate time of the events conclusion according to house wagering rules. Station Casinos does not recognize suspended games, result changes one hour or more after the events conclusion, protests, or overturned decisions, etc.

7. Minimum play requirements for betting purposes (unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display, games are official after):
- Football (professional and college) - 55 minutes of play.
 - Basketball (professional) – 43 minutes of play.
 - Basketball (college) – 35 minutes of play.
 - Hockey (professional, college, amateur) – 55 minutes of play.
 - Soccer (professional and amateur) - 90 minutes of play
 - Fighting, Mixed Martial Arts (professional and amateur) – When bell (buzzer etc.) is sounded signifying the start of the opening round the bout is considered official for betting purposes, regardless of the scheduled length. For fighting go/don't go, KO, decision and draw propositions, see rule # 10.
 - Baseball (major league, minor league, college, amateur) – In all nine-inning scheduled games, winners and losers are official after nine innings of play, unless the home team is leading after eight and one-half innings. Called or Suspended games must go a minimum of five innings or four and one-half innings if the home team is ahead (also applies to seven-inning scheduled games). If a game goes past five innings and is subsequently Called or Suspended, the winner is determined by the score after the last full inning of play; except in a case in which the home team scores to tie or take the lead in the bottom half of the inning in which the game is Called or Suspended, the runs do count. For baseball “totals”, run lines, and propositions see rule #11.
- (A) All contests not listed above that involve a predetermined length of play, time limit, distance, etc. that are not reached, yet the event is called final by event officials with a winner declared, shall also be considered official for betting purposes, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
- (B) All other contests not listed above that involve a scheduled length of play or time limit must play to their conclusion or have five minutes or less of scheduled playing time remaining when the contest concludes to be considered official for betting purposes.
- (C) All halftime (1st half and 2nd half), quarter, period, set, etc. wagering propositions must be played to the conclusion of that portion of play to be considered “Action”, and are independent of the game and other propositions. Soccer 1st half or 2nd half wagers must go at least 45 minutes to be considered “Action”.

- (D) Rules and minimum play requirements on “proposition” bets (statistical, match-up, player performance proposition wagers, “In Play”, (In-Progress, In-Game, etc.) wagers are the same as those for “totals” on that event, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
8. When wagering on “totals” (combined score, over/under) on contests involving a scheduled time limit, all game wagering rules applicable to minimum play requirements shall also apply to all “total” wagers, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
9. Auto Racing, Golf, Tennis:
- (A) All future book wagers on Auto Racing, Golf and Tennis are “Action” once player / Driver begins event unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
 - (B) All participants in event match-up or Player / Driver propositions must start the event, or that proposition is “No Action” and wager will be refunded.
 - (C) Most holes played wins golf match-ups. If holes are equal, then low score wins.
 - (D) If golfers listed in a match-up are involved in a 3 way (or more) playoff, either golfer involved must win the playoff to win that matchup, or proposition is “No Action” and wager will be refunded.
 - (E) All auto race wagers are on drivers only; not on a team or car, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
 - (F) Auto race results will be considered official for wagering purposes one hour after the events conclusion. At that time auto series recognized results and statistics will be used to determine all winners and losers. Subsequent changes will not be recognized.
 - (G) When wagering on auto race over/under cautions, lap leader or lead change propositions, all scheduled laps must be run for “Action”, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.

10. In "Fighting", mixed martial arts, etc. "Go/Don't Go" (will/won't go, over/under) proposition wagers, a full round is defined as one in which the bell (buzzer, etc.) has sounded signifying the conclusion of such round. If a fighter is counted out or the bout officially stopped prior to the bell, that round is not considered a full round for wagering purposes. If a half round (one minute and thirty seconds of a three minute round, 2 minute 30 seconds of a five minute round) or other specified time is listed, the official time of the bouts conclusion, as determined by ring officials, will determine proposition winners and losers.
 - (A) On fighting, mixed martial arts "K.O." proposition wagers, "K.O." includes knockout, technical knockout, disqualification, or any other stoppage.
 - (B) On fighting, mixed martial arts "Decision" proposition wagers, "Decision" means fight must go to the judge's scorecards to determine a winner; including technical decision.
 - (C) On fighting, mixed martial arts "Draw" proposition wagers; "Draw" means fight must go to the judges scorecards and be declared a draw; including technical draw.

11. When wagering on baseball "totals" (combined score, over/under), the game must go at least the regulation nine innings (eight and one-half if the home team is ahead) for a scheduled nine inning game and seven (six and one-half if the home team is ahead) for a scheduled seven inning game. Thereafter, if a game is called or suspended the score will be determined after the last full inning; unless the home team scores to tie or take the lead in the bottom half of the subsequent inning in which case the score is determined at the time the game is called. Listed or specified pitchers must start in over/under wager or there is "no action" and wager will be refunded.
 - (A) Rules for baseball propositions, run lines, and all baseball "in-play" wagers are the same as those for baseball totals, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
 - (B) On Baseball 5 Inning wagers, games must go 5 full innings and Both Specified (Listed) Pitchers must start for "Action". Winners and losers determined at the conclusion of the 5th inning.

12. Baseball wagers are accepted in the following manner:
 - (A) Action – team against team, regardless of the starting pitchers.
 - (B) One Specified Pitcher – A wager on or against one specific pitcher, regardless of other starting pitcher. Specified pitcher must start or wager is deemed “no action” and wager will be refunded.
 - (C) Both Specified (Listed) Pitchers – A wager that specifies both starting pitchers. Any variation constitutes “no action” and wager will be refunded.

Note: Each teams starting pitcher is defined for wagering purposes as the pitcher that throws the initial pitch.

13. In the event of a pitcher(s) change prior to the start of a baseball game, money odds may be adjusted. If one scheduled pitcher starts against an unscheduled pitcher, “Action” and live one “Specified (Listed) Pitcher” wagers will be computed at the opening price established by management with the new pitcher.
14. When wagering on “totals” (over/unders), overtime periods, extra innings, etc., are counted in the final score, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
15. On “half-time” wagers, scoring during the second half shall determine winners and losers. Overtime periods are included as part of the second half. On first half, quarter, period, inning wagers, set, etc., scoring during that designated portion of play only, shall determine winners and losers.
16. On “In-Play” (In-Progress, In-Game, etc.) wagers the final score or result shall determine winners and losers, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
17. If on the day of the events conclusion no winner is determined, minimum play requirements are not met or if “no contest” is declared, all wagers on that event will be considered “No Action” for betting purposes and wager will be refunded.

18. Soccer wagers are accepted in the following manner.
 - A. 90 minute – Wager is on the outcome of a soccer match, determined on the basis of the score at the end of 90 minutes of play and any time the referee adds to compensate for injuries and other stoppages.
 1. Wager does not include periods of extra time or penalty shootouts.
 - B. To Advance – Wager on a team in a soccer match to advance to the next level or round of competition.
 1. Wagers will be decided on the basis of the score at the referee's final whistle at the match's natural conclusion, whether the match is decided in regular time, extra time or in a penalty shootout.
 - C. Three Way – A wager in which there are three (3) possible outcomes in a soccer match.
 1. If the wagering offer on a match includes the draw as a third option and the match ends in a draw, wagers on the draw will be paid, while wagers on both teams will be lost.
 2. Three Way wagers will be decided on the basis of the score after 90 minutes of play and any time the referee adds to compensate for injuries and other stoppages.
19. Official league chairman, commission, sanctioning organization, etc., recognized statistics one hour after the events conclusion will be used to determine all statistical wagering propositions player performance proposition wagers and future book wagers.
20. Propositions - Various unique wagers may be offered from time to time. Terms for these wagers may be posted on guest wagering information sheets or odds display.
21. Wagering tickets are void after one year from date of the event conclusion. Winning tickets may be mailed in for redemption. See the reverse side of bet ticket for mail-in collection instructions and address.
22. Station Casinos assumes absolute responsibility for paying the mandatory .25% Federal Excise Wagering Tax required by law for wagering on sporting events and horse races.
23. Placing wagers or collecting winning wagers is prohibited by anyone under the age of twenty-one (21).
24. Nevada Gaming Commission/State Gaming Control Board regulations prohibit wagering from outside of the State of Nevada.

25. Station Casinos reserves the right to add, delete or change the Sports Book House Wagering Rules (subject to Nevada Gaming Control Board approval) and/or payoff odds.

26. Station Casinos offers account wagering through STN Sports, a Nevada Gaming Control Board approved system. STN Sports accepts sports wagers subject to the following:
 - (A) All applicable sports house rules apply to account wagering.
 - (B) Acceptance of account wagers from outside of Nevada is prohibited.
 - (C) A printed copy of comprehensive account wagering rules and procedures will be provided to account wagering patrons upon enrollment.

PAYOFF ODDS

(unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display; excluding parlay/teaser cards)

On all football and basketball straight wagers, players lay 11 to win 10 unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets or odds display. Wagering ties (with the point spread) are refunds.

PARLAYS

Note: In the event of a wagering tie, a two-team parlay reduces to a straight wager. One tie in three-team parlay reduces the wager to a two team parlay, etc.

Note: Maximum payoffs for parlays are 299/1.

BUYING HALF POINT OR MORE

On football and basketball straight wagers, players may buy a half point or more by laying 6 to win 5 (-1.20), or additional -0.10 or more from the current odds, on certain wagers selected by management.

Note: In the event of a wagering tie or no action, a two team teaser is deemed "No Action", and all money is refunded. A tie in a three-team teaser reduces the wager to a two-team teaser, etc.

BASEBALL / MONEYLINE STRAIGHT WAGERS

Players lay or take money odds. Money odds are always quoted in terms of \$100.

Example: Cubs -140

Player wagers \$140 to win \$100

Example: Dodgers +125

Player wagers \$100 to win \$125

BASEBALL / MONEYLINE PARLAYS

Baseball / Moneyline parlay payoffs are computed by multiplying the payoff conversion (odds equivalent to one dollar) of the teams in the parlay, by amount wagered.

Note: Maximum payouts on all non parlay card wagers are 299 to 1.



STATION CASINOS RACE BOOK HOUSE WAGERING RULES

GENERAL RULES:

1. Please check your ticket (receipt) for accuracy before leaving the wagering counter.
 - (A) Tickets go as written.
 - (B) Once a wager is accepted by both parties, tickets will not be altered or voided prior to post-time except at the discretion of management and with the approval of both parties. Wagers may only be rescinded with the approval of the Nevada State Gaming Control Board Chairman or his designee.
 - (C) Management will retain a record of all results and payout odds in case of obvious technical or human error.
2. A wager accepted after the official "Off Time" of a race is void, and money will be refunded.
3. Station Casinos is not responsible for lost, stolen, altered, or unreadable wagering tickets.
4. Station Casinos reserves the right to refuse any wager (s).
5. Station Casinos shall determine minimum and maximum wagers on all races.
6. All Races must be run on date and track scheduled. If a race is postponed and/or rescheduled to a later date, the event will constitute "No Action" for betting purposes and the wager will be refunded, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets.
7. Entries and field horses are classified as one betting interest unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets.
8. An Exacta, Daily Double, Quinella, Twin Quinella, Trifecta, Pick 3, Pick 4, Pick 6, or Superfecta wager accepted on a race where that specific wager is not offered constitutes "No Action" (Refunded).

9. Official results and mutuels as determined at the track on the day of the race will be considered official by Station Casinos for wagering purposes. All race proposition wagers, i.e. futures, horse match-ups, winning time over/under, etc., will be determined from these official results. Any subsequently overturned decisions will be disregarded. Races delayed beyond midnight are not recognized as date changes for wagering purpose.
10. All statistical and other data displayed on the race and sports book screens, wall boards, scratch sheets, etc. are for the convenience of our patrons only. Maximum care is taken to insure the accuracy of such information.
11. Winning Pari-Mutuel wagers may be cashed at the property purchased only.
12. In the event of a Pari-Mutuel system failure, or for any reason pari-mutuel wagers cannot be accepted, wagers may be accepted as House wagers and are subject to House wagering payout limits.
13. Station Casinos assumes absolute responsibility for paying the mandatory .25% Federal Excise Wagering Tax required by law for wagering on sporting events and horse races.
14. Station Casinos reserves the right to add, delete or change the Race Book House Wagering Rules (subject to Nevada Gaming Control Board approval) and/or payoff odds.

PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING RULES:

1. Station Casinos will pay full track odds on all Pari-Mutuel wagers.
2. Cancellations after you leave the wagering counter may be accepted at the discretion of management only.
3. Payoffs over \$50,000 may be delayed for 24 hours after the next banking day.
4. All Pari-Mutuel tickets are good for one year from the conclusion of the event date, or 30 days after the racing meet ends; which ever comes first.
5. In the case of a scratch (non-starter), the host track's current "No Action"/refund rules and policies and/or consolation payouts applicable to each wager type, shall apply.

6. All other Station Casinos Race Book House Wagering Rules apply, unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets.
7. Lost ticket claims may be accepted on Pari-Mutuel wagers at the discretion of management only.
8. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the Nevada State Gaming Control Board is final.

NON PARI-MUTUEL (“HOUSE”, “LIVE BROADCAST”) WAGERING RULES:

1. House wagering payout limits on all Live Broadcast (simulcast) horse races unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets are:

- (A) Straight wagers (win, place and show) full track odds on the first \$50.
Payout limit on the remaining wager balance is.....

PLACE	8/1
SHOW	4/1

- (B) Parlay payout limits:

WIN	100/1
PLACE	50/1
SHOW	25/1

Note: Each horse in a parlay is computed at track mutuels not to exceed a limit of 20/1 to win, 8/1 to place and 4/1 to show.

- (C) Daily Double, Exacta and Quinella payout limits are 150/1; with the exception of harness, dog tracks and off tracks, which are 100/1.
- (D) Pick 3 (Daily Triple) and Trifecta payouts limits are 500/1.
- (E) All other Exotic wagers not listed above, including Pick Six, Pick Four, Superfecta, etc. are 2000/1.

2. Station Casinos may offer a House Quinella. House Quinella payoffs are determined by multiplying the win mutuel of the 1st place finisher times one-half the place mutuel of the 2nd place finisher; unless an entry or field horse run 1st and 2nd. In such cases, the payoffs are determined by

multiplying the win mutuel of the 1st place finisher times one half the show mutuel of the 3rd place finisher.

(A) In Quinella wagering, entries and field horses go as one. Quinella wagers may be accepted on a six (6) horse field or more provided there are at least six (6) separate betting interests. If a field of six (6) horses or more is reduced to five (5) betting interests or less, Quinella wagers will be considered "No Action" and the wager will be refunded. In the event a three (3) horse entry or field finishes 1-2-3, the Quinella will be paid from the entry or field to the horse finishing fourth (4th). The Quinella payout will be computed on the mutuels of the entry or field, and the 4th place finisher.

3. House wagering payout limits on all non pari-mutuel Harness, Dog Tracks and Off Tracks (non simulcast) unless stipulated otherwise on guest wagering information sheets are:

Straight wagers (win, place and show) Full track odds on the first \$20 wagered across the board. The remaining wagers balance to be paid at:

PLACE	8/1
SHOW	4/1

Harness, Dog Track and Off Track (non simulcast) Exotic payout limits:

Daily Double	100/1
Quinellas	100/1
Exactas	100/1
Trifecta	500/1
Pick 3	500/1

All other Exotic wagers not listed above, including Pick Six, Pick Four, Superfecta, etc. are 2000/1.

4. In the event of a scratch (horse is officially withdrawn or is officially declared a non-starter), straight wagers are refunded; in a two horse parlay the wager becomes a straight wager, a four horse parlay is reduced to a three horse parlay, etc. A scratch in a Daily Double, Pick 3, Quinella, Exacta, or Trifecta, etc. constitutes "No Action" and money is refunded. When a scratch involves part of an entry or field, action goes on the remaining portion of the entry or field.

5. In the event that there is no winner at the track on a designated Trifecta, Superfecta, Daily Doubles, Pick 3, Pick 4, Pick 6, etc. wager, Station Casinos will honor those wagers that have correctly selected the order of finish or winning combination. Payouts will be based upon House Wagering payout limits. Station Casinos recognizes consolation payouts applicable to each wager type, up to full house limits.
6. In all future wagering, the winner as determined by the track at the conclusion of said event, will also be declared the winner for wagering purposes.
7. Wagering tickets are void after one year from the date of event. Winning tickets may be mailed in for redemption. See the reverse side of the bet ticket for mail-in collection instructions and address.



**STATION CASINOS
"TWIN QUINELLA"
RULES**

1. The "Twin Quinella" comprises two different races selected by management. Players must pick the winning Quinella (1st and 2nd finishers, in either order) in both designated races.
2. The cost per four horse combination is \$2. Multiple combination tickets will be accepted.
3. Management will provide the initial minimum jackpot.
4. The jackpot is aggregate. If there are multiple winning tickets the award will be divided equally.
5. In the event of a late scratch, wagers involving the scratched horse will be refunded. If a multiple combination ticket has a scratch, the combination involving the scratched horse will be "No Action" (Refunded) after the second "Twin Quinella" race, and live combinations will remain as "Action".
6. Both designated "Twin Quinella" races must run with a minimum of eight separate betting interests. If late scratches reduce a race to less than eight separate betting interests, the "Twin Quinella" for that day becomes void and all money wagered is "No Action" (Refunded).
7. The "Twin Quinella" is offered jointly by all participating Station Casino Race Books.
8. In the event of a dispute Management will make effort to resolve the dispute to the satisfaction of both parties. If the dispute is not settled by both parties the Nevada State Gaming control Board and Nevada Gaming Commission have jurisdiction over any unresolved dispute.
9. All Station Casino Race Book House Wagering Rules and Regulations apply to this promotion, unless stipulated otherwise in "Twin Quinella" rules or guest wagering information sheets.
